

## Are you in a dangerous situation? Questions to consider...

- ◆ How do you get by? Who do you depend on since you've been away from home/on the street?
- ◆ How did you meet this person(s)/your boyfriend/etc.?
- ◆ Has this person ever pressured you to do something you weren't comfortable doing?
- ◆ Have you ever exchanged sex for food, a place to stay or other things you needed?
- ◆ Are you required to earn a certain amount of money/meet a quota for this person?
- ◆ Have you ever been abused (physically, sexually, emotionally, mentally, etc.) or threatened by this person?
- ◆ Do you have to stay in the same place with other people who work for this person? What are the conditions like? Where do you sleep and eat?
- ◆ Has this person ever introduced you to hard drugs/prescription medication?
- ◆ Do you owe a debt to this person? Where did the debt come from?

## Our Services

24-hour intervention services for any Schuylers County youth, ages 10—24, who is homeless or is at risk of running away from home.

- ⇒ 24/7 Hotline: **607-742-9629** (call/text)
- ⇒ Appointment transportation
- ⇒ Conflict resolution/mediation
- ⇒ Emergency services (food, clothing, safety planning)
- ⇒ Referrals (employment opportunities, intensive counseling, mediation, educational/GED programs, alternative housing)

## Volunteer Host Homes Needed

By becoming a Volunteer Host Home you will be providing a runaway or homeless youth with a caring, safe and nurturing atmosphere. **The youth we serve rely on the generosity of the Volunteer Host Home Families to open their hearts and homes to youth in times of crisis.**

Youth remain in the Host Home for 30 days or less. Please call 607.535.2050 if you're interested in more information!

Youth between twelve and seventeen are more at risk of homelessness than adults.

## How to Help

Based on the assessment questions, or your observations, if you see any potential red flags, contact the **National Human Trafficking Hotline at 1-888-373-7888 for specialized victim services referrals or to report the situation.**

The presence of these red flags is an indication that further assessment may be necessary to identify a potential human trafficking situation.

**1 out of 7 young people between ten and eighteen will run away.**

## Helplines for Survivors

**211 Helpline** ..... **211**  
Links callers with essential human services, including shelter, employment, food pantries, support groups, and other services.

**First Step Victim Services** .....

Local hotline for anyone experiencing domestic violence or sexual abuse. Anonymous/confidential.

**National Domestic Violence Hotline** .....  
**1-800-799-SAFE**  
Provides confidential support to anyone experiencing domestic violence or an unhealthy relationship. Connects you to local supports or simply listens to your concerns.

**National Sexual Assault Hotline** .....  
**1-800-656-HOPE**  
Connects callers to their local rape crisis center. Callers can request assistance or just use the number to talk to someone who understands.

## Report Emergencies & Tips

Receives reports of missing youth and tips about missing and sexually exploited children. Relays tips to law enforcement representatives and provides support to the families of missing youth.

**National Human Trafficking Resource Ctr** .....

Accepts tips of trafficking situations, crisis calls from survivors, and calls from law enforcement and service providers.

**National Runaway Safeline** .....  
**1-800-RUNAWAY**

For teens who are thinking of running away from home, have friends who left home, or who left home and want to go back. Anonymous and confidential.

**Safe Harbour Program (Schuylers)** .....

Local hotline for teens who are thinking of running away from home, who left home, or who are in a trafficking situation. Anonymous and confidential.

**Statewide Central Register of Child Abuse** .....  
**1-800-342-3720**

Receives calls alleging child abuse or maltreatment. Relays information to local Child Protective Services, monitors their prompt response, and identifies if there are prior child abuse or maltreatment reports.
